Program 100

Faith Foundation (TH-100):

What is faith? What is God kind of Faith? Using the numerous biblical definitions of faith, this course will focus on what it means to have faith in God. Students will acquire a firm foundation of faith and hence be encouraged to adapt a personal life of faith in God.

Righteousness (TH-101):

Righteousness biblical defined as right standing with God. The course covers the types of righteousness that is imputed to the believer through Christ.

Renewing of Your Mind (TH-102):

This course conveys a powerful and imperative message that is highly applicable to all Christians, the purpose and power of having a renewed mind in Christ.

Life of Christ (TH-103):

The Life of Christ courses give an analysis of Christ life on earth emphasizing on the fundamental layout of His life and teachings as well as review the chronological order of His ministry on earth.

Teachings of Christ (TH-104):

What did Christ teach? These courses will examine Christ's teachings, review the order of events, and challenge students to examine the Biblical text correctly.

New Testament Survey (TH-105):

Provides a general summary and unique illumination of the life and teaching of Jesus Christ, by summing up the twenty-seven books of the New Testament.

Believers Authority (TH-106):

This course provides an understanding of the believers' authority in life. It is designed to challenge the student to practice his/her God given authority to make meaningful and Biblically guided changes through out their lives.

Divine Healing (TH-107):

Divine Healing is real and accessible to all believers through the work of Jesus Christ and his suffering on the cross. This course will allow students to examine the scriptural evidence of divine healing, God's will to heal his people, His means of healing, as well as examine various obstacles that prevents believers from receiving healing.

Helps Ministry (TH-108):

Using the life of Jesus Christ as the prime example, students will leave this course with an understanding of the value of serving in the Body of Christ and will have the

knowledge to find their place of service. This course will guide students to acquire/recognize their calling.

Ministry Credit (MCZ-109):

Students will earn three full credits per year for their active involvement in the church ministry, for voluntary service they provide to their local church and/or other approved entities.

Program 200

Holy Spirit (TH-200):

This course explores the Holy Spirit as part of the divine Trinity; the Holy Spirit is one with the Father and the Son. It is the promised gift given to all believers. The course also elaborates on the fruits of the Spirit and guides students to recognize the voice of the Holy Spirit.

Old Testament Survey I (TH-201):

These courses are part one of the series that will give the student a fundamental knowledge of the messages, themes, writers, and summaries of the Old Testament.

Old Testament Survey II (TH-202):

These courses will be part two of the Old Testament Survey. It will give the student a fundamental knowledge of the messages, themes, writers, and summaries of the Old Testament.

Life of Submission (TH-203):

Focuses on the biblical definition of submission to authority that needs to be exercised in all types of entity. The course affirms that all authority present whether at church or in the work field is all ordained by God.

Church Government (TH-204):

The five-fold ministry gifts are thoroughly examined in this course. The student will be able to understand the various functions of church offices, their roles, and governing abilities.

Purpose & Power of Prayer (TH-205):

Students who successfully complete this course will have a comprehensive knowledge of the scriptural purpose and power of prayer. They will examine various types of prayers, explore ways to build a prayerful life, and learn how to get results.

Blood Covenant (TH-206):

This course explains the monumental importance of blood covenants. It will survey all the major blood covenants from Genesis all the way to the blood covenant of Jesus Christ.

The Life of Paul (TH-207):

Who was Paul? This anointed and mighty man of God wrote one third of the New Testament Bible. The life of Apostle Paul and his ministry has left such an everlasting mark upon the Church and on the life of every believer.

Homiletics (TH-208):

The Homiletics course will provide the students the fundamental guide lines of teaching and preaching the Word of God. Students will be equipped in the preparation of a sermon as well as the effective methods of delivering a sermon or a teaching.

Ministry Credit (MCZ-209):

Students will earn three full credits per year for their active involvement in the church ministry, for voluntary service they provide to their local church and/or other approved entities.

Program 300

Angelology (TH-300):

This course will provide a comprehensive study of angels, focusing on their creation and behavior.

Demonology (TH-301):

This course will provide a comprehensive study of demons, focusing on their creation and behavior.

Christian Ethics (TH-302):

This course elaborates & challenges students to acquire Christian ethics based on the word of God.

Church History (TH-303):

Explores the development of the current church commencing from the day of Pentecost. Students will analyze the various changes and the history behind it.

Kicking Over Sacred Cows (TH-304):

What is a sacred cow?" A sacred cow is any practice, custom, tradition, or religious function that has progressed from its original purpose of serving to demanding to be served---creating an animal so deformed that it can't be dealt with, but must be destroyed." The course identifies the various types of religious traditions that hinder our spiritual walk and need to expose and remove them from the church.

Hermeneutics (TH-305):

This course will serve as a practice ground for students to exercise their calling, in the field of teaching and preaching. It will shape and mold students by providing them with strategies on preparing & delivering sermons. Furthermore, students will be taught how to study & interpret scriptures.

Acts (TH-306):

Emphasizes on the dominant working power of the Holy Spirit which is still being manifested in current season. The course illustrates on this particular ministry as witnessed in the early New Testament Church. Upon completion, students will be challenged to exercise this vital gift in their life and ministry.

Purpose-Driven Life (TH-307):

Through this course students will be inspired to determine their purpose in life. Hence, motivate prospective church leaders to acquire and identify their calling.

Contagious Church (TH-308):

This course affirms the need for churches to possess an influential and magnetic character. To mold churches that will attract believer and unbelievers. The course addresses key fundamentals rules involved in establishing such a contagious church.

Ministry Credit (MCZ-309):

Students will earn three full credits per year for their active involvement in the church ministry, for voluntary service they provide to their local church and/or other approved entities.

Program 400 – Christian Theology Track**Apologetics I (TH-400):**

This dynamic course is designed to train and equip students to defend their faith against any ideas that rebels against the word of God.

Systematic Theology I (TH-401):

This course equips students with extensive and supplemental studies such as anthropology, Christology, soteriology and ecclesiology. Upon completion, students will be trained to accurately defend the word of God.

Romans (TH-402):

This course focuses on the book of Romans such as who wrote it? To whom it was written? Conveys the vital message of the power and grace of God given to all man kind, both to the Jews & Genitals.

Trinity (TH-403):

Explores the origin, biblical basis and historical advancement of the doctrine of Trinity. This course will investigate the meaning of this doctrine.

Hebrews (TH-404):

Provides an in depth summary and elaboration on the book of Hebrews. In this course, great weight is placed on the life and role of Jesus Christ.

The Tabernacles of God (TH-405):

A relative study of the Tabernacles of God as mentioned in the Old Testament. This course will provide a thorough analysis on the Tabernacle of Moses, the Tabernacle of Heaven and the Tabernacle of David.

Principles of Leadership (TH-406):

What are the indispensable characteristics of a leader? What makes a leader influential and successful? This course highlights the various elements of leadership.

Spiritual Gifts (TH-407):

What are the nine gifts of the Holy Spirit described in the New Testament? This course will examine the purpose of these spiritual gifts which are only given to us by God.

The Children of Abraham (TH-408):

The course describes the history behind the birth of the three main religions; Christianity, Judaism and Islam, and their impact one mankind.

Ministry Credit (MCZ-409):

Students will earn three full credits per year for their active involvement in the church ministry, for voluntary service they provide to their local church and/or other approved entities.

Program 400 – Pastoral Ministry Track

Pastoral Theology (TH-411):

This course provides a concentrated focus on the ministry of a Pastor. Among other things, a Pastor will be responsible for conducting services like weddings, funerals, baptism and so forth.

Effective Evangelism (TH-412):

This course will illuminate the various effective methods needed in the ministry of Evangelism using biblical principles and examples.

Communicating The Message (TH-413):

This course reveals the importance of effectively communicating the gospel to the nations without any ambiguity. The course highlights the right resources, tools and techniques that will give prospective church leaders a powerful edge in communicating the message of God.

Purpose-Driven Church (TH-415):

This book encourages and teaches us to honor one another by obeying the word of God. It also needs to be done for the purpose of quality improvement within all the church.

Biblical Counseling (TH-416):

This course enables Christians to become skilled and compassionate counselors. The course illustrates strategies involved for biblical counseling.

Foundation of Youth Ministry (TH-417):

Provides fundamental teachings on which to build and sustain a successful youth ministry. The course will reveal the importance of the youth ministry and the impact it has on young people.

Five Star Church (TH-418):

What makes a church a five star? Emphasizes on accomplishing a healthy church. A church must be based solely on the word of God with the inclusion of fellowship, ministry, worship, etc.

Biblical Eldership (TH-412):

This course thoroughly explores the Biblical model for eldership and explains how a renewed focus on eldership is one of the essential components of a Church. Students will understand what the Bible says regarding Christian leadership

Worship Ministry (TH-412):

The teachings in this course are designed to strengthen worshippers and the church worship ministries using practical biblical insights. The topics focuses on expecting God's presence, worshipping in spirit and truth, being an example to others and etc.

Ministry Credit (MCZ-421):

Students will earn three full credits per year for their active involvement in the church ministry, for voluntary service they provide to their local church and/or other approved entities.
