Admission

Requirements

Applicant applying to Zadok must possess a high school diploma or proof of having passed the General Equivalency Diploma (GED) examination or show proof of an equivalent education.

Application process

The application process is conducted online and is accessible at www.zu-edu.org. Paper copies of the application can be requested one on the website.

Transfer Students

Transfer students must have sealed transcripts from their previous educational institution send directly to Zadok Theological Seminary in order to receive credit.

The registrar office at Zadok Theological Seminary will determine whether the credit transfers based on whether the course is equivalent to courses offered at Zadok Theological Seminary.

Number of hours and content of course will be the main factors used to evaluate whether credit transfers or not.

Tuition and Fees

Zadok Theological Seminary aims to provide quality spiritual education at the lowest cost possible in order to make this education as affordable to as many people as possible. Zadok Theological Seminary also offers several free courses by distance learning. The following outline the cost for the different programs offered at the university.

Costs and fees

→Application Fee \$20.00(one-time, non refundable fee)

→Tuition Fee Per Course paid every 4 weeks.

Student policies

Personal conduct

Students at Zadok University will be expected to carry themselves in a way that exemplifies good character both within and outside of the university. Students are expected to abstain from alcohol beverages and all illegal drugs. Students will also be expected to be exemplary in all their relationships especially relationships with the opposite sex.

Dress Code

Attendance and Tardiness

Students are expected to attend all classes and be punctual. If students miss class they must contact their professor and acquire the materials they missed. Failure to do will result in the students receiving an “incomplete” for the class.

Course requirements

In addition to regular and punctual attendance, students must complete all coursework and take all exams and papers.

Failing grades

If the student receives a failing grade, the student must pay the tuition fee again and complete the course in order to earn credit toward graduation.
